

Slinger / Signaller

Slinger Signaller(Novice/Experienced)



Target Group

Those who have, or required to have 'hands on' knowledge and/or responsibilities involving the use of lifting equipment used within their operational environment.

Aims

The aim of the course is to provide selected delegates with basic underpinning knowledge of lifting and slinging to enable them to carry out their lifting operations in accordance with statutory requirements and without risk to health.

Objectives

By the end of the course delegates will be able to:

- Demonstrate knowledge of the basic requirements of legislation, their legal obligations and responsibilities
- Demonstrate knowledge of force influences, sling configurations and safety precautions
- Estimate load weights
- Select appropriate lifting equipment for each lift
- Carry out pre-use inspection of lifting equipment
- Use appropriate hand signals
- Carry out successful lifting operations safely

Content

- Health and safety legislation as it applies to lifting operations and slinging/signalling
- Theoretical knowledge of lifting operations
- Operator's responsibilities with regards to daily/weekly checks of accessories and lifting equipment
- Use of accessories, types of hitch, pre-use checks and de-rating of accessories
- Practical sequence of operations, lift safety and signalling controlling loads



Achievements

This 1 day course is carried out in accordance with the code of practice for the safe use of lifting equipment as published by LEEA, and includes practical lifting operation assessments and Test leading to certification on successful completion.
